

Our Commitment to Sustainability

As long term residents of this pristine South West corner of Western Australia, the Jesters Flat team is absolutely committed to the preservation and protection of our natural environs. Jesters Flat offers horse back riding experiences through local farming communities and into the magnificent National Parks of Whicher (including the Rapids Conservation Park), Blackwood and Leeuwin Naturaliste. All riding into the National Parks is authorized by Commercial Operations Licenses with Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, including significant environmental management plans. We strongly encourage all riders to enjoy and care for the natural environment, leaving as small a footprint as possible. Some of our sustainable approaches include:

- Sourcing local products and services wherever possible
- All horse stable waste is collected for compost production. The compost is used on the Jesters Flat vineyard or sold to local gardeners.
- Bushland Rehabilitation plans in progress, including native species tree planting and invasive weed species removal.
- Vermin control to protect local fauna, Owl friendly baits used.
- Solar electricity
- Toilets are dual flush
- Shower heads are low flow
- Natural ventilation in guest areas
- Tents have recycled batteries lighting
- Gas hot water, on demand, not storage.
- Minimal fencing to encourage local animal corridors
- Adherence to the local Council recycling programmes. Recycling skip bins on regular hire.
- Use of recycled paper and natural products when possible. Discourage use of single use plastics, including water containers. Guests encouraged to bring reusable water bottles.
- Rainwater (filtered) and superficial aquifer water in use
- Biodegradable cleaning products
- No large trees removed unless diseased, however trees are sensitively pruned on a regular basis for safety.
